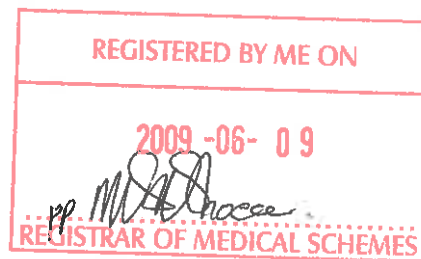
### ANNEXURE A

#### PARTICIPATING EMPLOYERS

1. The National Prosecuting Authority established in terms of the National Prosecuting Authority Act (1998);
2. The South African Social Security Agency established in terms of the South African Social Security Agency Act (2004);
3. The Government Employees Medical Scheme;
4. The Armaments Corporation of South Africa Ltd (ARMSCOR), for purposes of extending membership to existing GEMS members who are transferred from the Public Service to ARMSCOR in terms of section 197 of the Labour Relations Act;
5. The South African National Biodiversity Institute established in terms of the National Environmental Management Biodiversity Act (2004);
6. The Auditor-General established in terms of the Public Audit Act (2004);
7. The National Youth Commission established in terms of the National Youth Commission Act (1996);
8. The Parliament of the Republic of South Africa established in terms of Chapter 4 of the Constitution, Act 108 of 1996 for purposes of extending membership to employees of Parliament with effect from 1 February 2008;
9. The Office of the Public Protector established in terms of the Public Protector Act, 1994, for purposes of extending membership to employees of the Public Protector with effect from 1 February 2008;
10. The Education Labour Relations Council established in terms of the Education Labour Relations Act, 1993; and
11. The Council for Medical Schemes established by the Medical Schemes Act (131 of 1998) to provide regulatory supervision of private health financing through medical schemes.
